Ignite is a program for students with high intellectual potential.

Glenunga International High School is a Department for Education (DfE) Special Interest School funded to provide programs for Ignite students, previously known as 'Students with High Intellectual Potential' or 'Gifted and Talented'.

The DfE Ignite Program is also offered at The Heights School and Aberfoyle Park High School. The Ignite Program at Glenunga has been successful for over two decades.

Research shows that many gifted learners are working at a pace that is much slower than their capabilities.

Our Ignite Program offers students the opportunity to progress at an accelerated rate commensurate with their ability.

It gives students the opportunity to pursue excellence and strive for their personal best within a supportive environment. We develop holistic, well-rounded learners who have the skills to navigate our ever changing 21st Century world. The Ignite program creates balance between academic and social-emotional development.

Our teachers have a strong understanding of the gifted learner and how to support their social/emotional and academic needs. All staff receive professional development in *Understanding Giftedness* and program their curriculum delivery effectively to provide personalised learning journeys for students.



SELECTION PROCESS

Entry into the program is based on results in an ACER (Australian Council for Educational Research) assessment. The highest performing students are guaranteed direct entry into the school regardless of whether they live in or out of zone.

The ACER assessment comprises a four part test: Reading Comprehension, Written Expression, Mathematical Reasoning, Abstract Reasoning. It occurs once a year in February in the year prior to entering secondary school i.e. Year 6.

Registration is online and is accessed from our school website from Term 4 in the year proceeding the assessment.



WHAT THE IGNITE PROGRAM OFFERS

- Flexible learning pathways and opportunities, including vertical and horizontal acceleration.
- Curriculum that is challenging and engaging that aligns with the needs and interests of students.
- A program which removes unnecessary repetition and focuses on Critical and Creative Thinking skill development.
- Opportunities for students to engage and work collaboratively with intellectually and socio-emotionally compatible peers.
- A wide range of enrichment opportunities to complement the in-class learning taking place in classrooms.
- Support for learner wellbeing and explicit coaching in how to maintain balance in work-school-life.

IGNITE PROGRAM OPTIONS

From 2024 onwards our program will involve all Year 7 Ignite students experiencing an innovative and appropriately challenging curriculum for four terms, with increased opportunities to take responsibility for their growth, and to present their learnings in exciting ways. As Year 7s are moving into Year 8, there will be greater opportunities for vertical acceleration, as part of our improving on the past. This approach will support all our Ignite learners to grow in more meaningful and intentional ways.

We understand that our younger students really benefit from a sustained focus on building their social and emotional skills, in addition to a flexible approach to extension and acceleration in their traditional academic learning.

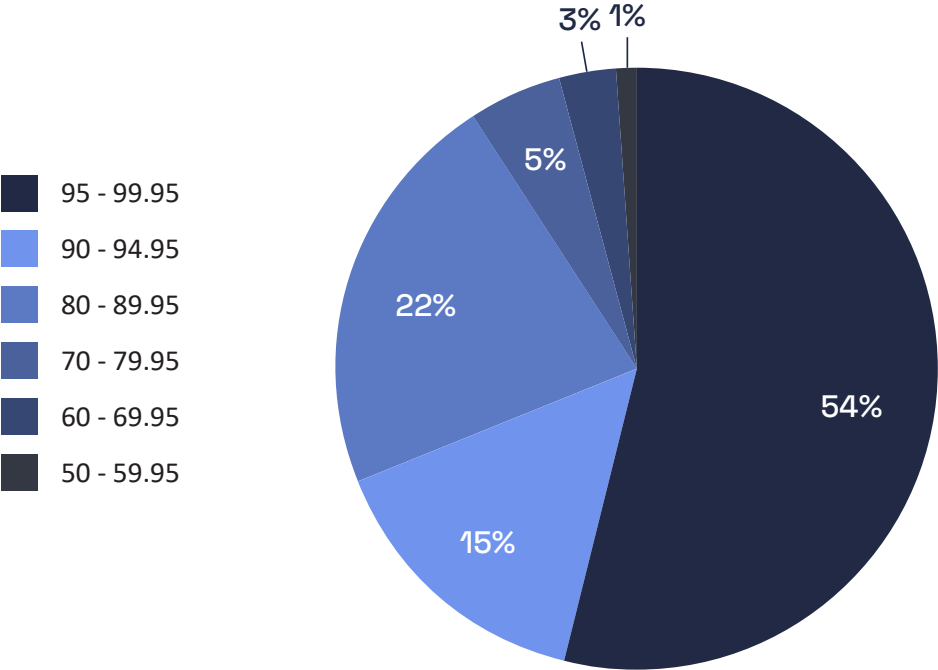
Year 7 students will work with their mentors and specialised Ignite subject teachers with a focus on developing their socio-emotional maturity and their 21st Century skills as well as their discipline knowledge and understandings. In Term 4 of Year 7, students will present evidence in their Learner Conferences of their readiness for one of three pathways in Year 8 the following year:

- A compacted program which delivers Year 8 – 9 in one year
- Acceleration in particular subjects e.g. Maths, English, Languages
- An all-rounder Ignite experience moving rapidly and deeply across a range of subjects.

From Years 7 through to Year 12 students remain with their peers in Mentor Group and select their subjects according to their specific pathway choices and interests. In Senior School students in Ignite may be studying a subject above their year level. This gives them opportunity to complete Year 12 over two years to better manage workload and maximise their ATAR. It also enables them to study a greater range of subjects at Year 12.
